I would like to officially welcome Fred Chiccone and Bill Johnstone as new members of the Board, and congratulate Loeda Stango on being re-elected. I also thank Michael Headman and Dick Crawford, outgoing Board members, for their service to the community. Both continue to be active within the Salt Pond.

While there were no major decisions that had to be made at the meeting, there were several issues that were discussed; namely, the paving of the roads and the subaqueous land concern.

Our third annual pool party was once again a success, and both children and adults had loads of fun. Many hot dogs, cookies and drinks were consumed. Our thanks to the Recreation

Committee for taking leadership in this project, and a huge thank you for all those who volunteered.

We are faced with several major projects in the foreseeable future. Our roads are in desperate need of repaving, and the roof on the community center needs replacement. The estimate for the roads is about one million dollars, and the new roof is estimated to be approximately \$60,000. We will keep you informed as costs are determined and the funding finalized.

Last summer, we had several homeowners who took it upon themselves to contact our vendors with concerns or complaints. At that time, we asked if you have concerns to please address them to Mary Davis, our Community Manager, and she would interact with our vendors. Again this summer, we have had a similar situation with a homeowner contacting the owner of the pool company with a complaint. Please do not take these matters into your own hands. It makes for a difficult working relationship, and they prefer to deal with Mary.

For those of you who rent your homes, or have guests visiting, please ask them to drive slowly through the community. Our roads are narrow and there have been several near accidents. Enjoy the remainder of the summer and we look forward to seeing you relaxing in our wonderful community.

Community Manager's Report



So far this summer has been sunny, hot, and frequently quite humid, representing a significant contrast from last year when it rained for almost the entire month of June.

Fortunately, your Board of Directors approved the installation of a new motor in the outdoor pool in the early part of the season, so we were able to accommodate almost record crowds over the July 4th holiday weekend. Because of the new motor, and the diligence of our pool operator company, our pool water is bright and blue and has never looked better. As an added feature, we now have two new games on the clubhouse patio area, lasso golf and a bean bag throw. The younger children have been making good use of these games, especially during the adult swim periods.

Adding to our list of improved recreational facilities, those of you who are tennis players will notice that our three courts have been completely repaired and resurfaced and that new nets have been installed. This is a sizeable expenditure, but is something that must be done every four or five years. For anyone who might be interested in a few tennis lessons for themselves or for children ages 4 to 12, we have local tennis pro Marty Godwin available again this year for instructions. I appreciate the homeowners who have responded promptly to any notice I may have sent regarding lawn and yard maintenance or housing repairs. It is our intention at all times to help maintain the integrity of the community, and the value of the homes, and it is in that nature that the notices are sent.

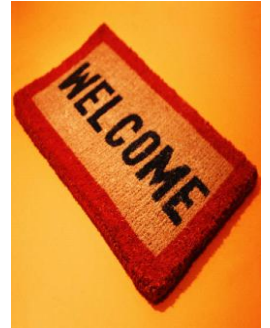

SPHA Treasurer's Report



Profit & Loss Statement

The SPHA accounting system is based on accrual accounting guidelines. Therefore, revenues are booked on invoices issued, not assessment payments made. Based on the June 2010 financials, the SPHA billed revenues were \$659,404 year-to-date (YTD). Most homeowners paid their assessment on time; however, a few homeowners still have not paid their 2010 assessments. The Board is in contact with these homeowners.

Expenses are booked as incurred. Through June, after \$358,663 in expenses is subtracted and \$22,753 in other income is added, the YTD 2010 net income was \$323,494.

Through March \$85,998 was added to reserves and \$43,877 was expended.

Audit

The 2009 audit is completed and reflects that there was a \$21,378 balance of income over expenses. The Board approved transferring this amount into reserves. A bound version of the 2009 audit is available in the SPHA Management Office. Just call Mary Davis to make an appointment.

2011 Reserve Study

The 2011 Reserve Study is in process. The Reserve Study is designed to forecast our community replacement costs over the next 15 years. The SPHA Engineering Committee, headed by Jim Beachboard, has done a very thorough review of updating all planned expenditure estimates. Over \$1.4 Million in expenditures are planned for the next 15 years with roads accounting for over one half of these expenditures. The 2010 Reserve Study is currently available for review in the Management Office.

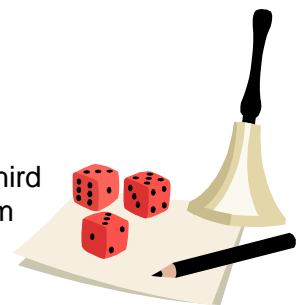

Salt Pond Golf Club Financial Summary

June was an exceptionally hot month resulting in golf cart and green fee revenues falling dramatically behind budget . This resulted in the year-to-date (YTD) revenues through June to fall behind budget. Year-to-date (YTD) revenues were \$273,006, but were budgeted for \$304,350. Golf Club expenses during this same period were \$351,125 vs. a budget of \$341,377, or \$9,748 behind budget. Therefore, in total, the Golf Club was \$41,644 behind budget. The Golf Club financial position should greatly improve from now until September as it has historically done. In fact, on the July 4th holiday weekend, revenues exceeded \$32,000. **A copy of the latest financial statement is included on the SPHA Golf Club web-site.**

Capital Improvements: The Golf Club has installed a much needed new water well. The total cost was approximately \$45,000. This should meet all water needs of the Golf Course in the future. In 2010, the Golf Club acquired eleven (11) new golf carts and a new lawn mower. All these capital items were included in the Five Year Capital Expenditure Plan. The five year plan is to ensure there is sufficient cash when needed to acquire capital equipment items in the future.

Carolyn Watkins

has been Court Appointed Special Advocate, or CASA, for children since 2003.

She became aware of this program via fellow Saltponder, Bill Shepard. CASA is an organization that works for the welfare of children removed from their homes for reasons of neglect or abuse. As a CASA, Carolyn represents children as an officer of the Delaware Court System, in what can be a difficult and confusing time for the child.



In the overloaded case worker's day, these children sometimes "fall through the cracks," and their special needs are not met. This is

when Carolyn's work begins. She sees that the child's physical, emotional and educational needs are addressed. It is her duty to visit the foster home to ensure that it meets the needs of the child. She does home visits and makes frequent phone calls to the child, and the foster parents, to ensure the child is safe, and proper services are being performed.

Psychiatric problems are always an issue, and it is extremely important that therapy sessions are attended by the child and the foster parents, and that any necessary medications are administered and maintained.

Educational issues are equally important to Carolyn as a former teacher. It is her responsibility to be in contact with the child's guidance counselor and principal, so she is aware of any academic or disciplinary problems as they occur.



As if all of that is not enough, Carolyn also attends court held review hearings at least every six months.

Carolyn is honored to be a CASA. "Sometimes all these children need is someone to listen, and to know they have

someone who cares by their side. "

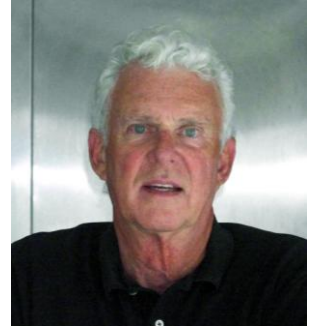

VOLUNTEER SHOWCASE

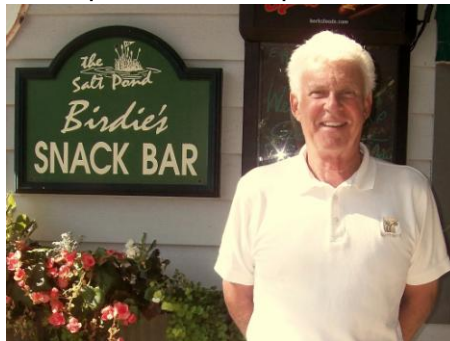
Charlie Smith

A couple of years ago, Charlie was asked to provide the SPHA guidance in its quest to upgrade the Community Center kitchen. His recommendations that we replace the outdated refrigerator and freezer with commercial grade equipment, and add additional food preparation and food service tables, has made the clubhouse a more attractive option for rentals.

Fred Hudson Bike and Pedestrian Path



As was reported in April, the SPHA Board has been working to improve safety for bikers and pedestrians along Fred Hudson road for several years, as well as improving traffic flow at the intersection of Route 1.

With Saltponder John Gilsenan's persistence, the SPHA received a letter from Carolann Wicks, Secretary of DeIDOT, with the good news.

DeIDOT recognizes the need for pedestrian and cyclists' access along this road, and has obtained the appropriate easements and funding to build a bike path! They are currently working with the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) to explore the best way to build such paths along Fred Hudson Road. She wrote, "Tentatively we anticipate that construction of the bike path will occur during winter 2010-2011."

Further she stated, "As for the turn lane off of Fred Hudson Road onto Route 1 southbound, more study was needed before moving forward. I'm pleased to report that DeIDOT will lengthen the turn lane to 200 feet long and increase the width to 12 feet. We are currently identifying a contract to which we can add this work, and thus the work should be done this summer.

Go Fish!



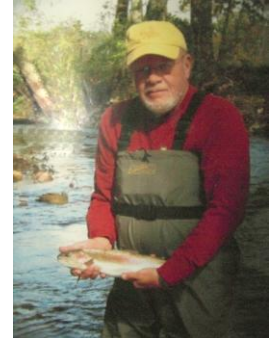
Salt Pond's roving camera caught this angler fishing the Noontootla Creek, in North Georgia. For anglers who enjoy trout fishing for fun, like Saltponder **Dave Watkins**, the Noontootla Creek has traditionally been a favorite destination.



On this day, it was Polly Dean's turn to take her **Uncle David** fishing after he patiently showed her the ropes of surf-fishing on the Delaware coast earlier in the year. Even though Dave is

an accomplished saltwater fisherman, this kind of fishing required learning a few more skills.

Dave used a 5-weight line with an olive Woolly Buggie and, using a couple feet of fluorocarbon tippet, added a Chamois Worm as a dropper. Got that? Being accustomed to catching saltwater species where there is no doubt when you get a strike, this action would be a bit different for Dave. After a few casting tips and pointers on using the strike indicator, he learned that the slightest change in direction or hesitation of the indicator means it's time to set the hook and hang on. He soon hooked into a rainbow, and a 17-inch brightly colored one at that!
